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## PBBM: P20/KG RICE HERE TO STAY, SOON IN MORE PUBLIC MARKETS P.2

### PH NAVY CONFIRMS 'POSSIBLE TRANSFER' OF ABUKUMA DESTROYER ESCORTS

MANILA – The Philippine Navy (PN) on Sunday confirmed the “possible transfer” of the Japan Maritime Self-Defense Force (JMSDF)’s Abukuma-class destroyer escorts.

The PN is now undertaking preparatory steps for a Joint Visual Inspection (JVI) of the ships following the official invitation from Japan’s Ministry of Defense.

“This planned inspection forms part of exploratory discussions on the possible transfer of these naval assets to the Philippines. Designed for anti-submarine and anti-ship warfare, the Abukuma-class destroyer escorts are known for their reliability and versatility, which align with the PN’s operational requirements in protecting the country’s maritime domains,” the PN said in a statement.

The Abukuma-class destroyer escorts have a displacement of 2,000 gross tons and a length of 109 meters and a beam of 44 meters.

It has a top speed of 27 knots and is armed with various anti-ship missiles, anti-submarine rockets and torpedoes along with a 76mm main gun and 20mm closed-in weapon system.

The JMSDF operated six Abukuma-class destroyer escorts, which were constructed from 1988 to



1991.

A delegation of naval experts from the PN will be dispatched to conduct an in-depth assessment of the ships.

“The outcome of this inspection will guide further deliberations on the potential acquisition and its alignment with the PN’s modernization efforts,” it added.

The PN said this initiative reflects the deepening strategic partnership between the Philippines and Japan, and reinforces the shared commitment to maritime security, interoperability and regional peace and stability. **(PNA)**

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### DOLE TO MONITOR WAGE HIKE COMPLIANCE IN NCR



MANILA – The Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) will visit various establishments in Metro Manila to check their compliance with the PHP50 wage increase for minimum wage earners, which takes effect on July 18.

“(Labor) Secretary Benne Laguesma has given instructions to regional and field offices in NCR (National Capital Region) to conduct labor

inspections to ensure the compliance of establishments with the new minimum wage and other labor standards,” Maria Criselda Sy, executive director of the National Wages and Productivity Commission, said in an interview at the Bagong Pilipinas Ngayon briefing on Friday.

Sy noted that companies employing 10 workers or fewer and establishments severely affected by typhoons or man-made disasters are exempted from the wage increase.

“We have an existing mechanism to apply for exemption,” she said.

Sy urged the public to visit their website for the process on how to apply for the exemption.

Early this week, the NCR wage board approved a PHP50 daily minimum wage increase in Metro Manila, which will benefit about 1.2 million workers.

The new minimum wage in Metro Manila now stands at PHP695, up from PHP645. **(PNA)**

# PBBM: P20/kg rice here to stay, soon in more public markets

MANILA – President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. assured the public that the government's PHP20 per kilo rice program is not a temporary measure and will soon be available in more public markets nationwide.

In his latest vlog released Sunday, Marcos said the program, being rolled out through Kadiwa ng Pangulo outlets for vulnerable sectors, is part of the administration's efforts to provide affordable food and strengthen the agriculture sector through sustained collaboration between the national and local governments.

"P20 rice is here to stay. It is achievable, it is sustainable. Kaya abangan ninyo (So, watch out for it) in your nearest public markets," Marcos said.

The initiative called "Benteng Bigas Meron na! (BBM)"

was one of Marcos' campaign promises, aimed at alleviating the burden of rising food prices.

The PHP20/kg rice is currently available to senior citizens, solo parents, persons with disabilities, indigent families, and minimum wage earners, with one million targeted beneficiaries by yearend.

As newly appointed national and local officials assumed office June 30, Marcos encouraged them to work together for service delivery.

"Tapos na po ang bahagi ng politika, serbisyo publiko na ang haharapin niyo ngayon (The political phase is over, now you are facing public service)," he said.

"Marami-rami tayong pagtutulungan sa lokal at national government at malaking bahagi ang LGU (local government unit) ng paghahatid natin ng serbisyo sa taum-

bayan (We have a lot to work on together between local and national government, and LGUs play a big role in delivering services to the people)."

Palay prices protected

Addressing concerns that the low rice prices may hurt farmers, Marcos reiterated that safeguards are in place to prevent the depression of palay (unhusked rice) prices.

He said the National Food Authority (NFA) is mandated to purchase wet palay at PHP18 per kilo and dry palay at PHP19 to PHP23 per kilo.

"Kahit ano pa ang maging presyo ng bigas, hindi po bababa dito ang pagbili ng NFA sa palay mula sa ating mga magsasaka (No matter the price of rice in the market, the NFA will not buy palay from our farmers below these rates)," he assured.

Marcos also cited

the continued roll-out of rice processing facilities and dryers across the country to empower farmers to store and process their harvest, instead of being forced to sell to traders at low prices.

Food security remains top priority

Marcos likewise reaffirmed his administration's focus on building a resilient

agricultural system to ensure food security, from farm production to processing, transport and retail.

On Wednesday, the President led the launch of the program at Zapote Public Market in Bacoor, Cavite.

It marks a major expansion of the PHP20 rice initiative, originally intended for pilot testing in the Visayas in May.

According to the Department of Agriculture's Agribusiness and Marketing Assistance Service, the program has already reached over 105,000 families in Luzon and the Visayas, distributing more than 804,000 kilos of rice between May 13 and June 30.

To date, 94 outlet sites have been established across the country. (PNA)

## LIPA ARCHBISHOP ELECTED TO SUCCEED CBCP PRESIDENT DAVID BY DEC. 1

MANILA – Lipa Archbishop Gilbert Garcera will be the new president of the Catholic Bishops' Conference of the Philippines (CBCP) by December.

According to the CBCP news website, the 66-year-old prelate was elected during the first day of the bishops' 130th plenary assembly in Anda, Bohol on Saturday.

He will succeed the Diocese of Kalookan's Cardinal Pablo Virgilio David on Dec. 1.

Garcera has been head of the Archdiocese of Lipa in Batangas province since 2017. He is also currently the CBCP Permanent Council's regional representative for Southeast Luzon.

CBCP officials serve two-year terms and may be reelected once, for a maximum of four years.

Garcera was ordained priest for the Archdiocese of Caceres in Naga City, Camarines Sur in 1983. In 2007, he was appointed bishop of Daet in the same province, then transferred to Lipa City.

Archbishop Julius Tonel, head of the Archdiocese of Zamboanga, was elected vice president.

The 68-year-old bishop will succeed Pasig's Mylo Hubert Vergara, who is also on his second and final term. (Ferdinand Patinio/PNA)

## P20.4-M SHABU SEIZED IN CEBU

MANILA – Authorities have seized some PHP20.4 million worth of shabu and arrested a businesswoman during a buy-bust in Cebu, the Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA) said on Sunday.

The PDEA news release said the suspect alias "Ann," 36, a flower shop owner, was arrested in Barangay Cansojong, Talisay City on Saturday by operatives of PDEA-Central Visayas, Philippine National Police Drug Enforcement Group and Naval Forces Central

Confiscated during the operation were

three packs of suspected shabu weighing around three kilos, buy-bust money, two smartphones, several identification cards, automated teller machine cards and transaction notes.

The pieces of drug evidence have been submitted to the PDEA-7 laboratory for chemical analysis and proper disposition.

The suspect is currently detained at a local PDEA station pending the filing of charges for violation of the Comprehensive Dangerous Drugs Act. (PNA)

## PBBM assures farmers won't be forced to sell their palay at a loss

President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. assured Filipino farmers that they would not be forced to sell palay at a loss, as the government will continue to purchase palay at fair prices, regardless of the market cost of rice, under his administration's Benteng Bigas Meron Na program.

President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. on Sunday dispelled speculations from some quarters that palay prices might decrease as the government lowers rice prices to as much as PhP20 per kilo.

"Kahit ano pa ang maging presyo ng bigas, hindi po bababa dito ang pagbili ng NFA sa palay mula sa ating mga magsasaka," President Marcos stressed in his BBM VLOG 271: Agrikultura posted on Sunday.

President Marcos reiterated that the National Food Authority (NFA) would maintain its minimum buying price—PhP18 per kilo for fresh or wet, and PhP19 to PhP23 per kilo for dry.

"Mayroon ngang nagsasabi na mayroon silang pangamba na dahil binaba ang presyo ng bigas, eh sasabay din ang presyo ng palay. Hindi

po totoo 'yan," President Marcos said in his latest BBM vlog.

"Ang dahilan kung bakit kayang baratin ng mga trader ang pagbili ng palay sa ating mga magsasaka dahil wala silang mga processing kaya basa ang hawak nilang palay. Napipilitan sila na ipagbili kaagad ito kung anumang presyo ang ibinibigay ng trader," the President continued.

The Marcos administration has established rice processing and drying facilities where farmers can bring their palay harvests, instead of selling fresh palay at low prices dictated by rice traders.

"Kaya naman ay nagkakat po tayo ng mga rice processing plant, daan-daan na mga dryer para 'yung farmer mayroon na siyang dryer, mamimili na siya kung saan niya dadalhin 'yung tuyo na niya na palay," President pointed out.

"Kaya hindi siya mapipilitan maipagbili 'yung kanyang palay kung anong presyo ang ibinibigay sa kanya ng trader," President Marcos said. (PIA)

DHSUD intensifies stakeholders' engagements to push PBBM's Expanded 4PH



Driven by President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s vision of having a more inclusive and sustainable housing landscape, the Department of Human Settlements and Urban Development (DHSUD) has intensified engagements with various stakeholders' groups to align and update government policies to the needs of the housing sector.

DHSUD Assistant Secretary Frank Lloyd Gonzaga, representing Secretary Jose Ramon P. Aliling, led the meeting with the Technical Working Group (TWG) on Price Ceiling Adjustment for Socialized Housing Developments on Thursday. Discussions revolved on the review and recalibration of policies for the pricing of socialized housing projects across the country.

The initiative ensures that the price ceiling and policies remain fair, practical, and responsive to the needs of Filipino families, striking a balance between affordability for homebuyers and sustainability for developers and partner agencies.

"We must ensure that our housing policies are responsive to the needs of our fellow Filipinos. We have to balance affordability and sustainability. This is not about numbers, this is about equity—making sure that no Filipino is left behind as we advance President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s vision of a more progressive Bagong Pilipinas through the implementation of the expanded 4PH," Secretary Aliling said.

The review forms part of the broader push under President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s Expanded Pambansang Pabahay para sa Pilipino

(4PH) Program, which now includes horizontal developments or subdivision-like housing projects, and other modalities to better cater to the needs of the Filipino people.

In addition, the discussions also reflect Secretary Aliling's 8-Point Agenda, which prioritizes housing policies that are aligned with the country's Sustainable Development Goals.

The TWG includes DHSUD officials, alongside representatives from the Subdivision and Housing Developers Association, Inc. (SHDA); National Real Estate Association, Inc. (NREA); Chamber of Real Estate and Builders' Associations (CREBA); and Organization of Socialized and Economic Housing Developers of the Philippines, Inc. (OSHDP).

The group aims to finalize its recommendations by October 2025 for the planned revision of Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2023-003 dated 19 October 2023 on Adjusting the Price Ceiling for Socialized Subdivision and Condominium Projects.

Previously, Secretary Aliling also met with officials of different non-government organizations and private groups to get their inputs on how to improve and expand the government's flagship housing program.

"The directive of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. is to really cater to the segment na dapat nating i-cater. Government housing should cater to all Filipinos, from the working class to the poorest of the poor. We are expanding 4PH to cover more vulnerable sectors, and make it more inclusive and sustainable," Secretary Aliling concluded. (PIA)

SUSPECT URGED TO FILE AFFIDAVIT VS. COPS LINKED TO 'SABUNGERO' CASE

MANILA – The suspect identified as "Alyas Totoy" in connection with the disappearance of over 100 "sabungero" (cockfighting enthusiasts) should file an affidavit to help build the case against the police officers allegedly involved, the Philippine National Police Internal Affairs Service (PNP IAS) said Tuesday.

In a press briefing held at Camp Crame in Quezon City, PNP IAS Inspector General Brigido Dulay said if Totoy files an affidavit implicating police officers, including seven dismissed cops, they could proceed with filing a criminal case.

"Wala pang inilalatag or inilalabas na affidavit itong sinasabing testigo na ito. Kami ay gumagawa na rin ng investigation at case buildup base sa mga dokumento na available ngayon (No affidavit has been filed or released by this alleged witness. We are also doing investigation and case buildup based on the documents available now)," Dulay said.

"Si alias Totoy did not avail of the WPP (Witness Protection Program). We are not aware of his whereabouts now. Insofar as IAS is concerned, we have no idea where he is hiding or staying or where he is being kept. Hindi pa namin makuhanan ng statement. Hindi naman importante sa amin na makausap si alias Totoy,

ang importante sa amin ay makita, mabasa at matingnan, ma-imbestigahan yung kanyang magiging salaysay dito sa missing sabungeros (We have not received a statement yet. It's not important for us to talk to alias Totoy, what's important for us is to see, read and look at, investigate the missing sabungeros)," he said.

Dulay also appealed to the victims' families to come forward to help build up the case against the allegedly involved officers.

Regardless of whether an affidavit is filed, Dulay maintained that the IAS has the power to conduct a motu proprio investigation.

Seven police officers were dismissed in 2023 in connection with the abduction of e-sabong (online cockfighting) master agent Ricardo Lasco.

PNP chief Gen. Nicolas Torre III said on Monday the IAS is working with National Police Commission (Napolcom) to investigate Totoy's claim that certain police officers colluded with a group responsible for the killing of the victims and dumping their bodies in Taal Lake in Batangas.

Earlier, Napolcom vice chair and executive officer Rafael Vicente Calinisan appealed to Totoy to submit his complaint affidavit "so we can investigate and hear



this case with absolute dispatch."

"Kami ay sumasang-ayon at kami ay susuporta sa galaw ng Napolcom. Magtutulungan kami dito sa kaso na ito (We agree and support the Napolcom's actions. We will work together in this case)," Dulay said.

Totoy also tagged a security guard from a cockfighting arena in Manila and a showbiz personality as connected to the mastermind behind the crime.

Justice Secretary Jesus Crispin Remulla assured the public that the government would leave no stone unturned in building up the case against so-called powerful figures. (PNA)

PINAY MORROCAN, INTERCEPTED FOR USE OF FAKE DOC

PASAY, Philippines — Bureau of Im-  
migration (BI) officers at Ninoy Aquino  
International Airport (NAIA) Terminal 1  
intercepted a Filipina suspected of being  
a victim of a mail-order-bride scheme.

With the country strengthening its  
stand against human trafficking under  
President Marcos' directive, Commis-  
sioner Joel Anthony M. Viado shared  
the interception of a 41-year-old Filipi-  
na woman who was being escorted by a  
52-year-old Moroccan man.

The identities of the victim and the suspect are  
withheld in compliance with anti-trafficking laws.

The female victim initially claimed she was  
traveling to Morocco via transit through the King-  
dom of Saudi Arabia (KSA) together with her al-  
leged husband on the late evening of June 29 at  
the NAIA Terminal 1.

However, officers found numerous inconsist-  
encies in their statements. "Upon separate ques-  
tioning, both individuals appeared evasive and  
suspicious when asked about details of their trav-  
el," said Viado.

The two presented a marriage certificate, insist-  
ing that they are married. However, details in the



said certificate remained inconsistent, prompting  
officers to refer it for forensic document checks.

The BI's anti-fraud section's forensic docu-  
ments laboratory confirmed that the document  
presented was indeed counterfeit.

Officers immediately turned over the duo to  
the inter-agency council against trafficking (IACAT)  
after they were found presenting a falsified docu-  
ment.

"We will not tolerate the use of fake or falsified  
documents being used in trafficking efforts," said  
Viado. "Individuals caught using fake documents  
shall face the harshest penalty of law," he added.

(vi) **ORDER** defendants to pay, jointly and severally, plaintiff moral damages of P50,000.00; exemplary damages of P50,000.00

Whereas, on May 30, 2024, plaintiff filed an Amended Complaint for Sum of Money, alleging that:

AMENDED COMPLAINT

Plaintiff GOLDEN ARCHES DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION, represented by Roberto G. Fortus, through the undersigned counsel and unto this Honorable Court, respectfully states that:

1. Plaintiff GOLDEN ARCHES DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION (“plaintiff GADC”), represented by its Franchise Manager Roberto G. Fortus (“Mr. Fortus”) , is a company organized and existing under the laws of the Republic of the Philippines and with principal address at 19/F BDO Towers Paseo, Paseo de Roxas, Makati City. Plaintiff may be served with notices, orders, and processes of this Honorable Court through the undersigned counsel at the address hereunder indicated. *Copies of the Articles of Incorporation of GADC and Secretary’s Certificate dated 06 November 2023 are hereto attached as Annexes “A” and “B”, respectively, and made integral parts hereof.*

2. Defendant MA. VICTORIA G. MARBELLA (“defendant Marbella”) is of legal age, Filipino, and with last known address at #61 Ermin Garcia, Cubao, Quezon City or Cluster 8 G1 Woodside Homes Hemady, Kristong Hari, Quezon City, where she may be served with summons and other processes of this Honorable Court.

3. This is a Complaint for the Collection of a Sum of Money due to the failure of defendant Marbella to pay plaintiff GADC the total amount of **THIRTY-NINE MILLION NINE HUNDRED TWELVE THOUSAND SIXTY-SEVEN AND 68/100 PESOS (PHP39,912,067.68)**, as of 31 December 2023. The said amount excludes claims for interest from 31 December 2023 up to present, attorney’s fees, as well as litigation costs. *A copy of the Summary of Charges is hereto attached as Annex “F” and made an integral part hereof.*

ANTECEDENT FACTS

4. Plaintiff GADC owns exclusive rights to manage the operations of McDonald’s fast-food restaurants in the Philippines. This includes the right to grant a franchise to operate McDonald’s restaurants and license to adopt and use McDonald’s System.

5. On 22 April 2001, plaintiff GADC sent a **Franchise Letter Agreement** offering defendant Marbella a franchise to operate the McDonald’s restaurant located in Mindanao Avenue Extension corner Tandang Sora, Quezon City (“**McDonald’s Mindanao Ave. Branch**”). Defendant Marbella accepted the offer and paid plaintiff GADC the amount of **Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Pesos (Php750,000.00)**. *A copy of the Franchise Letter Agreement dated 22 April 2001 is attached herein as Annex “G”, and made an integral part hereof.*

6. Moreover, she tendered **Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Pesos (Php250,000.00)** as a security deposit which shall answer for the faithful performance of the terms of the franchise agreements.

7. Furthermore, a **License Agreement** dated 22 April 2001 was executed between defendant Marbella and plaintiff GADC through McGeorge Food Industries, Inc. (“**MGFI**”), represented by its President, George T. Yang. By virtue of this contract, plaintiff GADC granted defendant Marbella the license for the adoption and use of the McDonald’s System at McDonald’s Mindanao Ave. Branch. *A copy of the License Agreement dated 22 April 2001 is attached herein as Annex “H”, and made an integral part hereof.*

8. To occupy the McDonald’s Mindanao Ave. Branch, plaintiff GADC, represented again by George T. Yang, and defendant Marbella entered into an **Operator’s Lease** dated 22 April 2001. The term of the aforesaid lease was coterminous with the **Head Lease** between plaintiff GADC and Spouses Oscar H. Ramirez and Elisa C. Ramirez, registered owners of the leased premises, by virtue of the Contract of Lease dated 29 December 1995. *Copies of the Operator’s Lease dated 22 April 2001 and Contract of Lease (Head Lease) dated 29 December 1995 are attached herein as Annexes “I” and “J”, respectively, and made an integral part hereof.*

9. Finally, plaintiff GADC, through George T. Yang, and defendant Marbella executed a **Lessor’s Interest Addendum (Sublease)** dated 22 April 2001 to manifest, among others, that the parties intend to create a sublease between them and not to effect an assignment of the Head Lease. *A copy of the Lessor’s Interest Addendum (Sublease) dated 22 April 2001 is attached herein as Annex “K”, and made an integral part hereof.*

10. On 09 February 2006, plaintiff GADC and defendant Marbella executed a **Supplemental Amendment and Addendum to the Franchise Letter Agreement /**

**License Agreement / Operator’s Lease** to amend the Percentage Rate from 9% to 6% and the covered period of minimum rent in lieu of the base rent. *A copy of the Supplemental Amendment and Addendum dated 09 February 2006 is attached herein as Annex “L”, and made an integral part hereof.*

11. Based on the **Franchise Letter Agreement, License Agreement, and Operator’s Lease**, the original term of the franchise commenced on 22 April 2001 and terminated on 11 October 2016.

12. However, by virtue of **Memorandum of Agreement (Supplement to Franchise Agreements)** dated 28 November 2016 executed by plaintiff GADC, represented by Mr. Fortus, and defendant Marbella, the term of the Franchise and License Agreements was extended for six (6) months or until 11 April 2017. On the other hand, the term of the Operator’s Lease was extended up to 11 October 2023. *A copy of the Memorandum of Agreement (Supplement to Franchise Agreements) dated 28 November 2016 is attached herein as Annex “M”, and made an integral part hereof.*

13. On 23 April 2018, plaintiff GADC and defendant Marbella executed a **License Extension Agreement (Amendment to the Franchise Documents)** extending the grant of franchise and license to defendant Marbella until 21 April 2021. *A copy of the License Extension Agreement dated 23 April 2018 is attached herein as Annex “N”, and made an integral part hereof.*

14. From April 2001 to April 2021, defendant Marbella operated McDonald’s Mindanao Ave. Branch under the terms of the aforementioned franchise agreements. In consideration of the rights to operate said franchise, defendant Marbella agreed to pay the following fees, hereinafter referred to as “**Corporate Accounts**,” to wit:

14.1. Monthly **Advertising Fee**<sup>1</sup> of five percent (5%) of the Store’s monthly gross sales for the entire duration of the license term payable on or before the tenth (10<sup>th</sup>) of the succeeding month.

14.2. Monthly **Royalty Fee**<sup>2</sup> of five percent (5%) of the Store’s monthly gross sales for the entire duration of the license term payable on or before the tenth (10<sup>th</sup>) of the succeeding month.

14.3. Monthly **Base Rent / Pass-thru Rent**<sup>3</sup> in an amount equivalent to the monthly rent payable by plaintiff GADC to Spouses Ramirez in accordance with the **Head Lease**, payable on or before the tenth (10<sup>th</sup>) of the succeeding month.

14.4. Monthly **Percentage Rent**<sup>4</sup> of six percent (6%)<sup>5</sup> of the Store’s monthly gross sales payable on or before the tenth (10<sup>th</sup>) of the succeeding month.

14.5. **Other Billings and Charges**<sup>6</sup> or any amount due to from Marbella for any billings, charges and advances made or supplied by plaintiff GADC on her behalf, payable within five (5) days from demand.

14.6. **Penalties**<sup>7</sup> for past-due payments of the abovementioned fees for the period beginning with the original due date for the payment to the actual date of payment at a rate of three percent (3%) per month.

15. Moreover, defendant Marbella undertook to abide with the **McDonald’s System** in operating the McDonald’s Mindanao Ave. Branch. This is a comprehensive restaurant system for the retailing of a limited menu of uniform and quality food products, emphasizing prompt and courteous service in a clean, wholesome atmosphere which is intended to be attractive to children and families.

16. Hence, in compliance with the uniform operation of all McDonald’s restaurants within the McDonald’s System, defendant Marbella orders directly from plaintiff GADC all designated food products and beverages through “**HAVI web**”. The aforesaid orders are delivered to McDonald’s Mindanao Ave. Branch by a third-party corporation, HAVI Logistics Philippines, Inc. (“**HAVI**”), and payments thereto are collected by GADC.

17. Over the course of two (2) decades operating the McDonald’s Mindanao Ave. Branch, defendant Marbella was frequently behind in her payments on the **Corporate Accounts** and products delivered by HAVI (“**HAVI Deliveries**”). Thus, she would often request plaintiff GADC for terms/staggered payment schemes to settle her obligation.

18. Sometime in 2020, plaintiff GADC noticed that defendant Marbella’s arrears were accumulating despite the continuous operation of the McDonald’s Mindanao Ave. Branch. She failed to pay her HAVI Deliveries since December 2019 and made minimal to no payments in her monthly Corporate Accounts.

19. Thus, on 22 July 2020, Ms. Belen Agulto (“**Agulto**”), manager of Billing and Collection of plaintiff GADC, sent an email to Marbella requesting immediate payment for May – June HAVI Deliveries amounting to Php2,014,115.70. The email also confirms the agreement between plaintiff GADC and defendant Marbella to schedule her total arrears for HAVI Deliveries in the amount of Php11,458,588.63 in a staggered payment scheme until December 2020. Despite her promise of substantial payment within the week, defendant Marbella failed to pay plaintiff GADC. *A copy of the email correspondence between Agulto and defendant Marbella is attached herein as Annex “O”, and made an integral part hereof.*

20. On 24 August 2020, Agulto sent a formal demand via e-mail to Marbella for immediate payment of her obligation in relation to the HAVI Deliveries in accordance with the approved staggered payment scheme. Again, defendant Marbella failed to comply with the same. *Copies of the e-mail and letter of Agulto are attached herein as Annexes “P” and “P-1”, and made an integral part hereof.*

21. Instead of paying her obligation, defendant Marbella negotiated with plaintiff GADC claiming that the McDonald’s Mindanao Ave. Branch was not earning well due to the pandemic and that she recently underwent a cataract surgery. Also, she promised to pay plaintiff GADC after receiving money from a certain inheritance.



22. Plaintiff GADC, for humanitarian purposes, acknowledged the financial difficulties of defendant Marbella during the pandemic. Hence, it extended the payment schemes of defendant Marbella to pay off her arrears since December 2019.

23. In April 2021, McDonald’s Mindanao Ave. Branch was affected by the government’s expropriation project. Consequently, said branch was permanently out of business on 01 May 2021.

24. On 19 April 2021, plaintiff GADC sent a letter requesting for a settlement proposal from Marbella pertaining to all the outstanding bills of McDonald’s Mindanao Ave. Branch in the total amount of Php25,885,536.56 as of 15 April 2021, detailed as follows:

A copy of the Request for Settlement Proposal dated 19 April 2021 is attached herein as Annex “Q” and made an integral part hereof.

25. On 08 October 2021, defendant Marbella, through her counsel Atty. Jan Michael R. Jongko of The Law Firm of Bartolome Salazar & Partners, offered to pay Five Hundred Thousand Pesos (Php500,000.00) in addition to the forfeiture of her alleged security deposit amounting to Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Pesos (Php750,000.00). A copy of the Settlement Offer of Ms. Ma. Victoria Marbella dated 08 October 2021 is attached herein as Annex “R” and made an integral part hereof.

26. On 10 November 2021, plaintiff GADC responded to Atty. Jongko rejecting the foregoing proposal of defendant Marbella considering the huge amount of her obligation and the ample time and opportunity already extended to her to settle the obligations. Moreover, plaintiff GADC likewise clarified that the security deposit of defendant Marbella was only Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Pesos (Php250,000.00) and not Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Pesos (Php750,000.00). A copy of the Response to the Settlement Offer dated 10 November 2021 is attached herein as Annex “S” and made an integral part hereof.

27. Despite numerous requests, defendant Marbella failed to make the required payments. In fact, there were even periods lasting several months when plaintiff GADC was unable to contact defendant Marbella, either through email or Viber messages.

28. On 30 June 2023, plaintiff GADC referred the matter to counsel, who then prepared a final demand letter requesting payment for Marbella’s total outstanding obligation amounting to **Thirty-Four Million Two Hundred Seventy Thousand Nine Hundred Six Pesos and 02/100 (Php34,270,906.02) as of 27 June 2023**, representing the Corporate Accounts, HAVI Deliveries, and Penalties. A copy of the Final Demand Letter dated 30 June 2023 is attached herein as Annex “T” and made an integral part hereof.

29. The final demand letter was attempted to be served personally to defendant Marbella at her last known address, #61 Ermin Garcia, Cubao, Quezon City. However, according to the security guard at that location, there is no individual named “Ma. Victoria G. Marbella” residing or working there.

30. Three attempts on separate days were made by the messenger of the undersigned counsel to serve the final demand letter; however, defendant Marbella could not be located in Ermin Garcia, Cubao, Quezon City. A copy of the Affidavit of Service dated 30 June 2023 is attached herein as Annex “P” and made an integral part hereof.

31. Thus, to ensure the receipt of the final demand letter, copies of the same final demand letter were sent to the following addresses of Marbella indicated on the franchise agreements through registered mail:

32. Out of the six letters, five (5) were returned to sender while only one which was sent to Marbella’s address in Cluster 8 G1 Woodside Homes Hemady, Kristong Hari, Quezon City were received by a certain S/G ESCALONA, B.L. on 14 July 2023.

33. Nevertheless, in accordance with paragraph 8.08 of the Operator’s Lease and paragraph 2.3 of the License Agreement, the abovementioned final demand letter is considered duly and sufficiently given to defendant Marbella, as it was sent via registered

mail to her address, to wit:

“8.08. **NOTICES OR DEMANDS** – x x x Any notice or demand from the Lessor to the Lessee **shall be deemed to have been duly sufficiently given if a copy thereof has been mailed by Philippine registered or certified mail in an envelope properly stamped and addressed to the LESSEE at the address of the subject Premises.** x x x Either party, by notice, may change the address to which notice shall be sent, but all notices mailed to the LESSEE at the address of the restaurant on the Premises shall be deemed sufficient.

23. **NOTICES** – Any notice hereunder shall be in writing and shall be delivered by personal service or by registered mail, with postage prepaid, addressed to Licensee at the Restaurant x x x. Either party, by similar written notice, may change the address to which notices shall be sent.”

34. From the foregoing, considering that the final demand letter was made in writing and sent via registered mail with prepaid postage to the address indicated in the license agreement, which is in McDonald’s Mindanao Ave. Ext. Tandang Sora, Quezon City, such notice is deemed sufficient and has been received by defendant Marbella.

35. As proof of service and mailing of the foregoing demand letters, the messenger of the undersigned firm executed an Affidavit of Service as attached herein as Annex “U” and made an integral part hereof.

36. As of 31 December 2023, defendant Marbella has a total outstanding liability amounting to Thirty-Nine Million Nine Hundred Twelve Thousand Sixty-Seven and 68/100 Pesos (PHP39,912,067.68), computed as follows:

37. The summary of each corporate account and the various system-generated Customer Billing Statements sent to defendant Marbella are hereto attached as follows:

A copy of the Summary of Corporate Accounts is attached herein as Annex “V” and made an integral part hereof.

Copies of the Summary of Advertising Fees and 16 Customer Billing Statements are attached herein as Annexes “W” and “W-1 to W-16”, respectively, and made integral parts hereof.

Copies of the Summary of Royalty Fees and 16 Customer Billing Statements are attached herein as Annexes “X” and “X-1 to X-16”, respectively, and made integral parts hereof.

Copies of the Summary of Percentage Rent to GADC and 15 Customer Billing Statements are attached herein as Annexes “Y” and “Y-1 to Y-15”, respectively, and made integral parts hereof.

Copies of the Summary of Pass Thru Rent to Landlord and 12 Customer Billing Statements are attached herein as Annexes “Z” and “Z-1 to Z-12”, respectively, and made integral parts hereof.

Copies of the Summary of Other Billing and Charges to GADC and 37 Customer Billing Statements are attached herein as Annexes “AA” and “AA-1 to AA-37”, respectively, and made integral parts hereof.

Copies of the Summary of Accumulated Penalties to GADC and 115 Customer Billing Statements are attached herein as Annexes “BB” and “BB-1 to BB-115”, respectively, and made integral parts hereof.

38. As shown in the table above, Marbella also failed to pay for the food products and beverages she ordered and were delivered to her McDonald’s Mindanao Ave. Branch by virtue of the agreement between HAVI and GADC. A copy of the Memorandum of Agreement between GADC and HAVI is attached herein as Annex “CC” and considered an integral part hereof.

39. From 10 December 2019 up to 23 April 2021, Marbella has an unpaid HAVI Deliveries which amounted to Php16,330,988.94, in addition to her liability in GADC’s Corporate Accounts. A copy of the Summary of HAVI Deliveries is attached herein as Annex “DD” and made an integral part hereof.

40. To explain further, in every order of plaintiff GADC product, HAVI generates both **Sales Invoice** and **Delivery Note** which contain the specific product ordered and its corresponding price. Thereafter, the Sales Invoice and Delivery Note will be delivered by HAVI to McDonald’s Mindanao Ave. Branch, together with the products ordered. As



proof of its delivery, an authorized personnel of McDonald's Mindanao Ave. Branch will sign on the Delivery Notes.

41. From 10 December 2019 up to 23 April 2021, defendant Marbella ordered a total of Five Hundred Three (503) orders of GADC products for delivery to her McDonald's Mindanao Ave. Branch. All 503 orders were duly received but left unpaid by defendant Marbella. *Copies of the 504 Sales Invoices and Delivery Notes are attached herein as Annexes “DD-1 to DD-503” and “DD-1-A and DD-503-A”, respectively, and made integral parts hereof.*

42. From the foregoing, defendant Marbella is liable to pay Plaintiff GADC the total amount of **Thirty-Nine Million Nine Hundred Twelve Thousand Sixty-Seven and 68/100 Pesos (PHP39,912,067.68).**

43. Plaintiff GADC is also entitled to the recurring interests of three percent (3%) per month of her unpaid Corporate Accounts from 31 December 2023 until the date of actual payment in accordance with paragraph 4(f) of the *Franchise Letter Agreement* and paragraph 10 of the *Licensing Agreement* both dated 22 April 2001, to wit:

“Should the Licensee/ or Lessee fail to pay or incur delay in the payment of the amounts due under paragraph 1 &2, an interest of three percent (3%) per month shall be imposed on said due amounts. The amount of interest on the due rent shall be as indicated in Section 3.05 of the Operator’s Lease.”<sup>21</sup>

44. In view of Defendant's breach of her obligation, plaintiff GADC was compelled to engage the services of the undersigned counsel to vindicate its rights and institute this case. Accordingly, plaintiff GADC incurred attorney's fees in the amount of Five Hundred Thousand Pesos (Php500,000.00) to institute this action, plus an appearance fee of Ten Thousand Pesos to Three Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (Php10,000.00 – Php3,500) per hearing. *A copy of the Engagement Contract is attached herein as Annex “EE” and made an integral part hereof.*

45. In accordance with paragraph 24 of the *License Agreement* dated 22 April 2001, plaintiff GADC shall also be entitled to recover from defendant Marbella such reasonable attorney's fees as may be proved in the course of the trial, together with court costs and expenses of litigation.

“24. **COST OF ENFORCEMENT** – If licensor institutes any action at law or in equity against Licensee to secure or protect Licensor’s rights under or to enforce the terms of this License, in addition to any judgement entered in its favor, Licensor shall, be entitled to recover such reasonable attorney's fees as may be allowed by the court together with court costs and expenses of litigation.”

46. Lastly, the complaint is one of the exempted cases on compulsory process of arbitration under P.D No. 1508, otherwise known as the Katarungang Pambarangay Law, repealed and now replaced by R.A. No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991. One of the parties being juridical person pursuant to Administrative Circular No. 14-93.

## GOD’S SPIRIT AND WORD COMPLETELY GIVES LIFE

Ezekiel 37:9-11

When the Israelites where despairing because of their exile, they described their situation through an extreme imagery “*Our bones are dried up, and our hope is lost; we are indeed cut off.*” (v11). They have no life in them. They are left worthless and useless. However, v9 actually showed God’s powerful compassion to produce life in them.

Ezekiel was ordered to preach, and his immediate response was to obey. He did not ask for other ways, nor suggested other methods, nor offered his specialty. He immediately obeyed and prophesied the Word.

Many today are actually neglecting this ordained means of God. Some churches do not want to focus on preaching as it seems an old trend for the modern society where gimmicks are needed to sell. They focus more on Man’s emotions than in God’s glory. This is unfortunate because if we follow the pattern set in the Scriptures, there has never been any other way to give life to humanity and bring them to God—it is only through the Word of God. From the Garden, to Ezekiel, to the Apostle Paul—who declared that faith comes through hearing, and hearing through the Word of God—it has consistently been the Word that gives life

The preaching of the Word remains the means for people to have faith that leads to salvation. Even the sacraments—baptism and the Lord’s Supper—point in that same direction.

The sacraments restrain us from considering other ways of bringing the message of salvation to people. They remind us that it is only through the sacrifice of Christ that we are saved. As long as the sacraments point to Christ, we are not permitted to create alternative methods of witnessing to others.

They may be compared to the illustrations in a book. The illustrations do not add anything to the story but help clarify it. Not only do the Word and the sacraments share the same content—namely, the promise of God—but they also have the same origin: God.

In a world where entertainment is more valued than the actual demand of the Bible, where trends keep you relevant, and applause makes ministry impressive, will you trust and obey the silent and ordinary means of God’s grace to bring life to dry bones of hopelessness? In God there is life, not only temporarily, but an eternal life.

4PS BENEFICIARIES URGED TO MAXIMIZE GOV’T AID FOR LONG-TERM GAINS

BAGUIO CITY – Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) – Cordillera Director Maria Aplatén on Friday encouraged beneficiaries of the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4Ps) to fully utilize the assistance they receive to improve their lives and secure a better future for their families.

“To the children of 4Ps, study hard and finish school to increase your chances of employment or livelihood opportunities that will uplift your lives,” Aplatén said in a phone message to the Philippine News Agency.

She noted that while 4Ps provides financial aid, educational support, and livelihood opportunities, beneficiaries must take the initiative to actively improve their circumstances.

“They won’t be in the program forever. They have to help themselves while support is still available,” she said.

On Thursday, the DSWD-Cor-

dillera awarded outstanding 4Ps families and students during the regional search for the “Huwarang Pamilya” and “Huwarang Estudyante.”

The Saguiot family of Tinglayan, Kalinga, who joined the 4Ps in 2008, was declared the regional winner and will represent the Cordillera in the national search.

Parents Rebecca and Henrik raised six children, three of whom have already finished college and are now pursuing postgraduate studies.

Rebecca, a designated “Parent Leader,” credits the 4Ps for transforming her family’s life and building her leadership and community involvement skills.

“We are ready to graduate

from the program,” she said.

The region’s outstanding student representative, Lex Francis Leigh Salibad of Lubuagan, Kalinga, said that 4Ps support helped him excel academically.

“I value self-discipline and education most. They can never be taken away,” he said.

## PH lifters win more medals in Asian Youth, Jr Championships

MANILA – The Philippines secured four silvers and four bronzes on Saturday to increase its medal haul in the Asian Youth and Junior Weightlifting Championships in Astana, Kazakhstan.

Jhodie Peralta of Zamboanga City pocketed five medals in the women's 53kg class at Qazaqstan Arena.

In the Youth category, she placed second in snatch (84kg), clean and jerk (97kg) and total (181kg), while in the Junior category, she was third in snatch (84kg) and total (181kg), and fifth in the clean and jerk (97kg).

Jerick Icon Castro, competing in the Youth 56kg category, got one silver in snatch (105kg) and two bronzes in the clean and jerk (128kg) and total (233kg).

Meanwhile, Prince Keil Delos Santos of Angono, Rizal was fourth in snatch (119kg), and seventh in both the clean and jerk (135kg) and total (254kg) in the Junior 60kg category.

(1 gold, 48kg), Princess Ann Diaz (1 silver and 2 bronzes, Youth 44kg.), and Aleksandra Ann Diaz (1 silver and 1 bronze, Youth 48kg) also snagged medals during the opening matches Friday.

The Youth division is for athletes aged 13 to 17, while the Junior division is for competitors 15 to 20 years old.

## Filipino netters triumph in ATF U16 Series 2 in Malaysia

MANILA – As Filipino tennis sensation Alex Eala continues to make history, her younger compatriots are also making the country proud with their achievements.

At the Melaka Asian Tennis Federation (ATF) Under-16 Series 2 in Malaysia over the weekend, the Philippines dominated the doubles category in both boys and girls' divisions.

Top seeds Lucas Go and Kenzo Brodeth defeated fourth seeds Shun Him Luk and Cun Hiu Chan of Hong Kong, 7-5, 6-2, in the boys' doubles final.

The unseeded pair of Arriana Reign Maglana and Louraine Jallorina secured the girls' doubles crown with a stunning 6-0, 6-0 upset of Indian Ahana Das and Filipino Ave Polcarpio, the tournament top seeds.

Maglana, 13, is from Maragusan, Davao de Oro, while Jallorina hails from Iloilo City. They won the U18 doubles title at the Juntaphil Cup held at the Philippine Columbian Association (PCA) Manila in April.

Jallorina also bagged the mixed doubles bronze medal at the 2023 Batang Pinoy National Championships in Manila.

"We're both happy to win our first title abroad and we would like to thank the Philippine Tennis Academy (PTA), Tito Oscar Hilado and Tito Romy Chan for their all-out support," the 15-year-old Jallorina said in an



interview Sunday, referring to the PTA officials.

The four players are gearing up for the two-leg J60 Phinma International Tennis Championships starting next week at Manila Polo Club in Makati City.

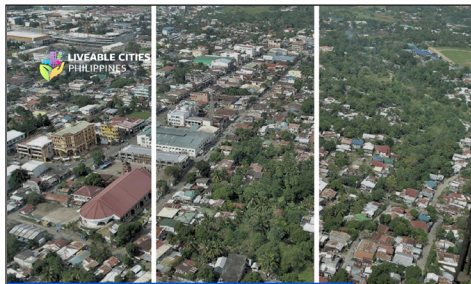
"Considering that they are all rookies, they did very well in Melaka," PTA coach Bobie Angelo, a multi-medalist in the Southeast Asian Games, said.

"I see a very bright future for our young players. They train hard and always give their best on court. They have the potential, they just need more exposure abroad to improve their skills and gain confidence. Hopefully, they can also perform well in the upcoming J60 events."

## Dengue Cases Rise



### CAUAYAN CITY

Cauayan City, one of the top 50 global finalists for the 2025 Bloomberg Mayors Challenge, proposed an early warning system for dengue outbreaks that uses data from mosquito traps, sensors, and other sources to better alert residents.

### THE PROBLEM

Dengue remains a major threat in the Philippines; however, limited access to vaccines and health facilities hinders effective response. Therefore, proactive prevention strategies are urgently needed.

Dengue cases in Isabela continued to rise in 2025, with 659 cases reported from January to February 21—up from 434 cases during the same period in 2024. The increase has been linked to the rainy season, which contributes to the spread of mosquitoes.

### Project C-Dews (Community Dengue Early Warning System)

Project CDEWS is an in-house development of the Business Intelligence Research and Development Center, a collaborative project between Cauayan LGU, Isabela State University, and the Department of Science and Technology under the Smarter City Project.

It is an online platform using an IoT-based OL trap to predict the level of household mosquito infestation and provide early warning and recommend sanitation practices to prevent dengue.

From January to February 21, 2025, dengue cases in Isabela rose to 659—up from 434 during the same period last year.

To address the surge, the Cauayan City Local Government—one of the Philippine cities named among the top 50 finalists in the 2025 Bloomberg Global Mayors Challenge—has proposed Project C-DEWS (Community Dengue Early Warning System). The proposal aims to strengthen public health through an early warning system that raises awareness, alerts households, and encourages active community participation in dengue prevention.

Project C-DEWS is an online platform that uses an IoT-based OL trap to predict household mosquito infestation levels. It provides early warnings

and recommends sanitation practices to help prevent the spread of dengue.

This project is a collaboration between the Cauayan LGU, Isabela State University (ISU), and the Department of Science and Technology (DOST) under

the Smarter City Project.
