3 MORE DPWH EXECS DISMISSED OVER FLOOD CONTROL MESS

MANILA - The Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) on Monday ordered the dismissal from service of three officials from its Bulacan 1st District Engineering Office (DEO) in connection with the anomalous flood control projects in the province.

In a decision dated Sept. 15, DPWH Secretary Vivencio Dizon dismissed former Assistant District Engineer Brice Ericson Hernandez, Construction Section Chief Jaypee Mendoza, and Accountant Juanito Mendoza after they were found guilty of administrative charges such as "disloyalty to the Republic of the Philippines and to the Filipino People, Grave Misconduct, Gross Neglect of Duty, and Conduct Prejudicial to the Best Interest of the Service under Section 63(A)(1)(d), (f), (h), and A(2)(a) of the 2025 RACCS (Rules on Administrative Cases in the Civil Service)."

were imposed with perpetual disqualification to hold public office, a penalty that states that they can never hold any position in the government.

The decision noted that the dismissal penalty makers. is "without prejudice to the filing of separate civil or criminal charges."

Cayetano-led E-Governance Law to transform PH's public service



The Philippines is poised for a digital revolution with the enactment of the E-Governance Law (Republic Act No. 12254), a landmark measure championed by Senate Minority Leader Alan Peter Cayetano designed as a gateway to unprecedented public service efficiency.

In a statement, Cayetano said the law is intended "not only for us to catch up, but to lead us through the possibility of e-governance amid robotics, Artificial Intelligence and during this digital age."

"Only God knows the limitation on e-governance. Halos unlimited ang opportunities. Think of it and it can be done. Gusto niyo ng e-payments, transactions na walang pila, na gamitin ay isang app lang, facial recognition — magagawa po ito sa bagong batas," Cayetano said on September 11, 2025.

The E-Governance Act, which was signed by the President on September 5, 2025, is expected to enhance government efficiency, streamline services, and promote transparency through the use of Information and Communications Technology – ensuring that both citizens and businesses benefit from digital transformation.

Cayetano sponsored the measure in the 19th Congress as chair of the Senate Committee on Science and Technology.

Alongside the Konektadong Pinoy Law which he also authored and sponsored, the Minority Leader stressed that robust infrastructure must be in place to fully implement the E-Governance Law.

"Hindi ito parang isang bill na kapag ginawa natin ay solved na lahat kasi right after this. Some of our people may say, 'Uy maganda 'yang E-governance Law, pero wala naman signal o mahal naman internet sa amin.' We shouldn't take this law by itself. Kung hindi ibi-build y'ung infrastructure sa digital age, hindi mo makukuha ang benefits ng digital age," he said.

"E-Governance is not per se the solution to all of our problems. But it is a tool that, if used effectively and assigned properly to various agencies, can address many of our challenges today," he added.

Marcos Jr. launches electric 'Love Bus' revival program

MANILA (PIA)—President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. on Saturday urged commuters to use the newly revived "Love Bus," the iconic 1970s transport service now modernized with electric buses offering free rides and reduced fares across Metro Manila.

Speaking at the launch of the Love Bus "Libreng Sakay" program at Valenzuela Gateway Complex in Valenzuela City, Marcos said the 20-bus fleet aims to reduce pollution, traffic congestion and transportation costs for daily commuters.

"We are reviving this now... But now it's newer, not like before — the normal bus. These are electric. And this is a big help to reduce pollution, to reduce oil costs," Marcos said.

The President emphasized the program addresses common commuter challenges including long waiting times, heavy traffic and air pollution in the capital region.

"Take advantage of our new Love Bus to reduce fares and save a little," Marcos said. "Traffic will be reduced, pollution will be reduced because it's electric, and this is a big help for our situation here in Metro Manila."

The electric buses will provide free rides for persons with disabilities and senior citizens. Students will receive 50% fare discounts under the program, Marcos announced.

All rides will be free throughout September as part of the launch promotion.



The original Love Bus was introduced during the administration of Marcos' mother, former first lady Imelda Marcos, who served as Metro Manila governor in the 1970s.

That program aimed to make public transportation more accessible and affordable.

"We chose Valenzuela because I know that if there's any city that can make this program beautiful, it's our brave leaders here in Valenzuela, the Gatchalians," Marcos said, thanking the host city's leadership.

The launch event was attended by Sen. Sherwin Gatchalian, Valenzuela 1st District Rep. Kenneth Ting Gatchalian, Social Welfare Secretary Rex Gatchalian and Valenzuela Mayor Weslie Gatchalian.

The buses will operate on various routes throughout the metropolitan area, though specific routes were not detailed at the launch. (JCO/PIANCR)

Palace orders Independent Commission for Infrastructure to start work immediately

The newly created Independent Commission for Infrastructure will immediately begin investigating anomalous flood control and related projects from the past 10 years, with Malacañang expressing hopes of completing the probe within a few months.

The Palace on Saturday announced that President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. has appointed former Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) Secretary Rogelio L. Singson and SGV

and Co. Country Managing Partner Rossana A. Fajardo as the two members of the ICI, as well as Baguio City Mayor Benjamin Magalong as the Commission's Special Adviser.

"The Commission will begin its work immediately," Presidential Communications Office Undersecretary and Palace Press Officer Claire Castro said in a press briefing.

Castro said the ICI would work in the fastest time possible, although the extent of the investigation into corruption, irregularities, and misuse of public funds in DPWH flood control and related projects over the past decade is considerable.

"Wala pong masasabi agad na timeline. Ang pinaka-timeline dito ay mas agaran o mas mabilisang pagtatrabaho. At mas mainam po matapos po ito sa loob lamang ng ilang buwan," Castro said.

"Pero sabi nga po natin, sa dami po ng records na dapat aralin ay bigyan po natin ng pagkakataon ang ICI na aralin lahat ang mga dokumento para po kapag po may sinampahang kaso ay kumpleto naman po ang mga dokumento,"



Castro added.

President Marcos will announce the chairperson of the ICI in the coming days, according to Castro.

Under Executive Order No. 94, President Marcos tasked the ICI to investigate and gather evidence and information on irregularities in government flood control and infrastructure projects.

The ICI shall also recommend the filing of appropriate cases before the Office of the Ombudsman, Department of Justice, Civil Service Commission (CSC), and other competent bodies, and propose corrective measures to ensure transparency and accountability in infrastructure programs.

Malacañang reiterated that the ICI members would conduct their investigation impartially and thoroughly.

"Kagaya nang paulit-ulit na sinabi ni Pangulo, walang sasantuhin dito kahit kamag-anak, kaibigan, kaalyado. There will be no sacred cows," Castro said. (PND)

PBBM clears out P3.5M medical bills of 3 Valenzuela Medical Center patients

To cap his birthday activities, President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. brought joy to many as he visited Valenzuela Medical Center (VMC) on Saturday to check on the implementation of the government's zero balance billing policy, or the Bayad na Bill Mo program.

The zero balance billing policy implemented in Department of Health (DOH) hospitals, ensures that patients admitted to

ward or basic accommodation services do not incur out-of-pocket expenses for their treatment.

Upon his arrival at VMC, the President was warmly welcomed by hospital staff members holding banners with birthday greetings.

Accompanied by First Lady Louise Araneta-Marcos and presidential son, Joseph Simon, the President toured several key facilities of the hospital, including the pediatric ward, the Kangaroo Mother Care ward, and the surgery section.

During the visit, the President witnessed how the Bayad na Bill Mo program cleared out three patients' medical bills totaling over



PhP3.5 million.

The three beneficiaries were Delia Paaño, 75, who is battling with acute respiratory failure and incurred a hospital bill of over PhP1.8 million; Johnny Mercado, diagnosed with sepsis, whose hospital bill reached over PhP1.1 million; and a newborn named Prince Ibrahim Arbolado with a medical bill amounting to more than PhP610,000.

Launched in August, the zero balance billing policy has already benefited thousands of Filipinos nationwide.

In his latest podcast, President Marcos reaffirmed the sustainability of the program, stressing that public funds are meant to provide vital health services. **(PND)**

BI deports key figures in Japan crime network

PASAY, Philippines—Six Japanese nationals identified as members of a notorious crime syndicate were deported by the Bureau of Immigration (BI), following President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s directive to intensify the country's campaign against transnational criminals.

BI deportation and implementation unit chief Atty. Alex Arciaga reported the deportation of Hiraki Ishikawa, 46; Tsubasa Amano, 30; Akira Sambonchiku, 26; Naoto Matsumoto, 36; Rintaro Yamane, 28 and Masato Morihiro, 38.

The 6 individuals left Ninoy Aquino International Airport (NAIA) Terminal 1 on board a Japan Airlines flight to Tokyo, morning of September 10.

It can be recalled that the said Japanese nationals were arrested on May 21 by the BI's fugitiv search unit (FSU) in two separate operations in San Jose del Monte, Bulacan and Ermita, Manila

Rintaro and Masato were arrested in a condominium unit along Adriatico St. in Ermita, while the rest were found in a residential area along Quirino highway in Bulacan.

The group were identified by Japanese authorities to be members of the notorious 'JP Dragon' group, wanted in their home country for large-scale fraud. The syndicate is implicated to be involved in a range of illegal activities, mostly fraud, targeting senior citizens in Japan. Their modus is to impersonate authorities to deceive



victims into giving large sums of money.

The syndicate allegedly stole ATM cards and posed as law enforcers to harass and deceive their elder victims in surrendering bank cards and other banking information under the pretext of a police investigation.

A summary court in Fukuoka, Japan has issued arrest warrants against five of them last March 5 due to charges of theft that were filed against them, while Matsumoto was found to be an overstaying alien.

BI Commissioner Joel Anthony Viado lauded the deportation, saying that the BI has effectively dismantled the crime syndicate's operation in the Philippines.

"The deportation of the members of the JP Dragon group means their operations have been dismantled," said Viado. "The collapse of their fraud operations in the country shows that we will not tolerate the presence of foreign syndicates that exploit our people and undermine our laws," he stated.

The names of the 6 members have been included in the BI's blacklist, effectively barring their re-entry to the Philippines. (BI)

NCRPO ON FULL ALERT FOR MASS RALLIES

MANILA – The National Capital Region Police Office (NCRPO) on Friday went into full alert status for possible demonstrations of groups over anomalous flood control projects.



"The full alert

status is effective at 3 p.m. Friday," NCRPO chief Maj. Gen. Anthony Aberin told reporters in a text message on Friday.

Aberin said his personnel will observe maximum tolerance during the demonstrations and will uphold the rule of law.

"We respect and uphold the constitutional right of every Filipino to assemble and express their views. At the same time, we remind everyone that these freedoms must be carried out peacefully and responsibly, without endangering public safety or disrupting community life," he said.

"Our police units are on full alert and ready to protect both demonstrators and the general public. Security measures have been set to prevent untoward incidents such as clashes, vandalism, and traffic disruptions, while ensuring that the rights of all are safeguarded," Aberin added.

Aberin also appealed to rally organizers and participants to act with discipline and respect the law.

"We also advise the public to remain alert, avoid protest areas when possible, and cooperate with authorities for everyone's safety," the Metro Manila top cop said.

Philippine National Police (PNP) spokesperson Brig. Gen. Randulf Tuaño earlier said 2,500 police officers will be deployed for the demonstrations.

"They started at 6 a.m. From this time on, there are no more disturbances or large groups protesting... we expect the meeting to be held later this afternoon, which will be at the EDSA Shrine and People Power Monument," he added.

The Police Regional Office (PRO) 3 (Central Luzon) and PRO 4A (Calabarzon) assured the public of their safety despite reports of mass protests.

In a statement also on Friday, the PRO 3 said appropriate measures have been put in place to maintain order while safeguarding the rights of the public.

"In this regard, the police have reportedly been instructed to show maximum tolerance and follow proper protocol in managing public gatherings," it said.

The PRO-4A said it has coordinated with local government units in Calabarzon to ensure peace and order in the region.

"We remain on alert and are closely monitoring activities that may affect the free movement of people, vehicles, and essential services in key areas. Our mission is to keep Calabarzon safe, peaceful, and a business and tourist-friendly region," it said in a separate statement.

PNP acting chief, Lt. Gen. Jose Melencio Nartatez Jr. said the police force is closely monitoring the local security situation and is ready to suppress any form of unrest. (PNA)

'Handog ng Pangulo: Serbisyong Tapat Para sa Lahat' Distribution of Emergency Housing Assistance Program (EHAP)

This leg of the 'Handog sa Pangulo: Serbisyong Tapat Para sa Lahat' by President Marcos Jr. aims to help residents recover and rebuild their homes after the damage caused by Typhoons Crising, Dante, Emong and the southwest monsoon last July 2025.

pagbangon at pagsisimulang muli...At pinaparami pa po namin ang aming progresibo at sustenableng komunidad patungo sa isang Bagong Pilipinas. The fake ORs were found to bear the old PDIC logo, contain misspellings, falsified signature/s of PDIC personnel, and generally inconsistent with the standard format of authentic PDIC-issued ORs. The PDIC reiterated that the PDIC logo has been officially changed since 22 June 2018.

The PDIC reminded the public to transact only with PDIC-authorized personnel at the PDIC office located at PDIC Chino Building, 2228 Chino Roces Avenue, Makati City 1233.

The public was encouraged to exercise vigilance and verify the authenticity of all PDIC-related documents for their transactions. Suspicious documents must be reported to the PDIC Public Assistance Department (PAD) through any of the following official channels:

The hub, proposed to be built in Cagayan de Oro City proper, will extend these benefits to seafarers in Northern Mindanao.

In support of this initiative, DOST highlighted its program specifically designed for OFWs.The IFWD PH Program is one of the reintegration pathways for seafarers and their families, providing training, consultancy, and innovation funding to help them establish sustainable livelihoods. 48 hired on-the-spot at 31st WCO in Baguio

BAGUIO CITY — At least 48 job seekers were hired on the spot during the 31st World Cup of Opportunities at the Baguio Convention and Cultural Center.

TESDA Benguet Provincial Director Arlene Cadalig said that the recently conducted WCO was able to employ on the spot a total of 48 applicants from Baguio City and Benguet.

There were also at least 26 individuals who were "nearly hired" or those applicants who have a strong potential to be hired but still need to provide additional documentation or fulfill other requirements.

Cagalig said that the WCO serves as a one-stop shop for government agencies, private companies, technical-vocational education institutions, and other partners to offer employment and various services to the public.

The WCO is in celebration of the World Tech-Voc Day annually every August 25 but the activity was moved due to the unforeseen circumstances.

"The purpose of TESDA is not only to train but also offer employment opportunities to our technical vocational graduates and the WCO was intended for tech-voc graduates but it was also opened for all job seekers," Cadalig said.

"We also want all our training institutions to be here, and those who want to enroll, so they can also ask what programs are offered by our training institutions here in Baguio City and Benguet," she added.

This year's WCO served more than 700 iob

seekers applying to 20 employers with more than 600 local employment and more than 1,000 overseas job opportunities.

Aside from job opportunities, various government agencies also provided their services during the WCO including the BIR, DOLE, DTI, DICT, DOST, DOT, DMW, OWWA, PRC, SSS, PHIC, and PESO Baguio.

The DICT also provided free services to the applicants such as free internet access, free printing services, the use of their computers aside from offering ICT trainings and the e-Gov Services or the digital IDs.

Micro, small, and medium enterprises also displayed and sold their products during the activity while the training schools provided health and wellness services such a BP screening, massage, nail care among others.

Meanwhile, the individuals who were hired on the spot expressed gratitude to the TESDA and the different government agencies for providing an activity such as the WCO where they were able to land jobs.

During the opening program of the WCO, the TESDA also turned over tool kits to tech-voc scholars while initial training support funds were also turned over to identified training schools.

"Agpaspasalamat ak kadagitoy government agency ta isuda nangtulong kanyak nga maka apply ken maala ti trabaho ijay Japan. Daytoy ti chansak nga agsubli ijay Japan ta ituloy ko ag OFW para iti pamilyak, (I thank the different government agencies for their support that helped me get hired to work in



Japan. This is a chance for me to go back to Japan and work as an OFW for my family)," said Augusto Sao-ang from Poblacion, Tuba, Benguet who was among those who were hired on the spot during the WCO.

Sao-ang is a former OFW who worked in Japan as a farmer in a program under the provincial government of Benguet and the Japanese governmentJennylyn Anniban from Buguias, Benguet also expressed gratitude to the TESDA and the other government agencies that helped her be hired as a kitchen crew in one of the well-known bakeries in Benguet.

"I am both excited and nervous, this is my first time joining a job fair but I am happy that I was hired on the spot as a kitchen staff of a well-known company in Benguet. Thank you to TESDA and to the government agencies that helped us and now we have jobs," Anniban said. (RMC-PIA-CAR Phinma/UPang Interns)

Of tunas an, Mun. of Muntinlupa, Prov. of Rizal, Is. Of Luzon. - 4. On December 19, 2002, the plaintiff and the defendant executed a Contract to Sell, under whose provisions, the plaintiff agreed to sell, and the defendant agreed to buy the above described parcel of land, together with its existing improvements, it any, subject to the following terms and
 - 1. PURCHASE PRICE The purchase price for the said, real property with all the existing improvement, shall be PESOS: ONE MILLION FOUR HUNDRED THOUSAND AND 00/100 (P1,400,00.00), to be paid by the BUYER at the SELLER'S office located at 777 Sedeño corner Paseo de Roxas, PSBank Center, Makati City without need of notice and/ or demand as follows:
 - a. **DOWNPAYMENT-** The amount of **PESOS:** THREE HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND AND **00/100 (P350,00.00)**, as down payment upon the

execution of this contract;

- b. BALANCE OF PURCHASE PRICE -The balance of (P1,050,000.00) shall be paid within THREE (3) years upon execution of the agreement, which balance shall be covered by postdated check issued upon execution of this agreement.
- c. INTERESTAND PENALTY ONBALANCE OF PURCHASE PRICE - The balance of PESOS: ONE MILLION FIFTY AND 00/100 (P1,050,000.00) shall bear interest/penalty as follows:
 - c.1 The first twelve (12) monthly installments due from the date of execution of the contract shall be subject to an interest rate of NINE PERCENT (9%), and installments due for the next 2 years or 24 months shall be based on prevailing bank interest rate of that fiscal year.
 - c.2 The BUYER shall issue post dated checks, in batches of twelve (12), to cover the monthly installments due for ONE (1) year of the THREE (3) YEAR installment term until fully paid.
 - c.3 Any unpaid installment or any transaction thereof not paid on its due date shall be subject to penalty at the rate of THREE PERCENT (3%) per month from the due date until fully paid.
- d. Value added tax (VAT), if any, applicable on this sale based on present and future laws.
- 2. **DEFAULT** -In the event the BUYER fails to pay the balance of the purchase price due under Par 1 (b) or fails to comply with any terms, conditions, or obligations herein stated, then the SELLER may cancel this contract by giving the BUYER a written notice thereof, in which case the downpayment paid pursuant to Par. 1 (a) shall be deemed forfeited in favor of the SELLER by way of liquidated damages and lost business opportunities.

Should the SELLER not opt to cancel this contract, it shall have the right to collect penalty at the rate of three percent (3%) per month for the balance or a fraction thereof from date due until fully paid.

Notwithstanding the non-cancellation and the imposition of penalty interest provided above, the SELLER shall not be precluded from thereafter canceling this contract based on any later default, or if the BUYER continue to be in default. Such remedy shall be in addition to other remedies provided by law.

The BUYER acknowledges that the SELLER has no actual possession of the said property with all existing improvement. However, in the event that this CONTRACT is rescinded due to BUYER'S non payment of the purchase price or failure to comply with any other terms, conditions, or obligations stipulated herein, the BUYER shall promptly vacate the premises within five (5) days from date of notice/ demand to vacate without dismantling any existing improvement whose title and ownership shall follow and vest in the SELLER.

A copy of the said Contract to Sell is hereto attached and incorporated by reference as Annex "A".

- 5. Upon execution of the said Contract to Sell, the defendant was allowed to take possession and occupy the subject property.

The defendant violated the terms and conditions of the said Contract to Sell when she failed to pay the monthly amortizations due and payable under the Contract to Sell from March 30, 2003 to February 20, 2004, amounting to P397,676.73, net of penalties and other charges, as indicated in the Statement of Account attached and incorporated herein by reference as Annex "B".
- 7. In view of the plaintiff's failure to pay the said amortizations due despite demands, the plaintiff cancelled the said Contract to Sell by way of a Notice of Notarial Cancellation sent to the defendant at her given address

which she received on February 26, 2004, through a certain Jane Catenza, a copy of which is attached and incorporated herein by reference as **Annex** "C".

- 8. Thereafter, the plaintiff demanded from the defendant that she vacate the premises and surrender its possession to the plaintiff as stipulated in the said Contract to Sell, however, the defendant failed and refused to do so, despite such demands. A copy of the notice to vacate upon the defendant is attached and incorporated herein by reference as **Annex** "D".
- 9. In view of the continued and unjustified failure and/or refusal of the defendant to vacate premises and surrender possession of the subject property to the plaintiff, the latter was compelled to institute this complaint and to hire the services of counsel, to protect its interest, for which it agreed to pay the amount of P50,000.00 as attorney's fees.

PRAYER

ACCORDINGLY, it is respectfully prayed that after notice and hearing, judgment be rendered in favor of the plaintiff and against the defendants as follows:

- i. Ordering the defendant and all persons claiming rights under ther to vacate the subject property and to surrender possession thereof to the plaintiff;
- 2. Ordering the defendant to pay the plaintiff P50,000.00 as attorney';s fees;
 - 3. Ordering the defendant to pay the costs of suit.

Other appropriate reliefs are also prayed for.














Over 186,000 Borrowers Avail of SSS Calamity Loan Program, P3.4 Billion Released

The Social Security System (SSS) recently launched its enhanced Calamity Loan Program (CLP) with over 186,000 borrowers availing of the program resulting in total loan release of about Php3.4 billion to date.

The Program, designed to provide swift financial relief to members affected by natural disasters, features lower interest rates, faster processing, and more flexible terms.

"This is very good news for our fellow Filipinos in need of urgent financial assistance who live or work in areas declared under State of Calamity due to the combined effects of Southwest Monsoon and Tropical Cyclones Crising, Dante, and Emong," said Department of Finance Secretary Ralph G. Recto, who also serves as Chairperson of the Social Security Commission. "On top of that, we've also lowered the interest rate to make it more affordable — from 10% to just 7% per annum."

SSS President and CEO Robert Joseph M. de Claro emphasized the agency's commitment to responsive service: "With the issuance of the revised CLP guidelines, SSS is now able to provide immediate financial relief to mitigate the impact of natural disas-

ters and help our members recover under liberalized terms and conditions," De Claro said. "We streamlined the activation process to implement future Calamity Loan Programs within just seven working days and allowed loan renewal after six months."

The Calamity Loan Program is available to members residing or working in areas officially declared under a State of Calamity. Eligible members may borrow up to Php20,000, with a two-year repayment period. Loan proceeds are released through UMID ATM cards or PESONet-participating bank accounts, ensuring transparency and efficiency.

For the current CLP, provinces under State of Calamity are La Union, Bataan, Pampanga, Cavite, Rizal, Laguna, Oriental Mindoro, Occidental Mindoro, and Antique. In the National Capital Region (NCR), calamity-hit areas are Quezon

City, Marikina, Navotas, Manila, Valenzuela, Caloocan, Las Piñas, Parañaque, Muntinlupa, and Malabon.

Other areas also declared under State of Calamity include Aguilar, Alaminos, Anda, Bani, Binmaley, Bolinao, Burgos, Infanta, Labrador, Lingayen, Basista, Mangatarem, Urbiztondo, Bayambang, Calasiao, Malasiqui, Mangaldan, San Carlos, Santa Barbara, Dagupan and Umingan in Pangasinan; La Trinidad and Tuba in Benguet; Balagtas, Bocaue, Calumpit, Paombong, Hagonoy, Guiguinto, Meycauayan, Obando, Marilao and Bulakan in Bulacan; Paniqui, Camiling and Moncada in Tarlac; Masinloc in Zambales; Agoncillo, Nasugbu, San Luis, Tanauan, Tingloy and Laurel in Batangas; Roxas in Palawan; Concepcion in Romblon; Pototan in Iloilo; and Cebu City.

The SSS has earmarked Php20 billion for the program in 2025 which is more than twice the amount spent for 2024, underscoring its commitment to supporting Filipino workers during times of crisis.

"While SSS launched the enhanced CLP with reduced interest rates to qualified members, the core principles of financial well-being remain unchanged emphasizing the value of work, save, invest, and prosper," De Claro added.

FIVB Worlds: Argentina survives Finland in 5 sets; Egypt stuns Iran

MANILA - Argentina came back from a twoset deficit to turn back Finland, 19-25, 18-25, 25-22, 25-22, 15-11, at the start of their campaign in the FIBV Men's World Championship at Smart Araneta Coliseum in Quezon City on Sunday.

Pablo Kukartsev and Luciano Vicentín were the architects of the impressive comeback of world No. 8 Argentina, with the hard-hitting opposite scoring 20 points (16 kills, three blocks, one ace) and the outside hitter adding 19 (18 kills, one block).

"We struggled a lot in the first two sets, but that's kind of normal as this is the first match in the tournament." setter Luciano De Cecco said. "We tried very hard to win the match, and we put a lot of effort into it. There's a lot of weight in the first match of the World Championship, and I believe it makes a big impact on the team's campaign. A victory in the opening match can take you a long way, and we're happy that we got it."

Finland had a more balanced offense and saw four players with double-digit scoring. Opposite Jonas Jokela led the way with a match-high 26, followed by outside hitter Luka Martilla (18) and middle blockers Petteri Tyynismaa (17) and Severi Savonsalmi (11).

"It was a great game," Martilla said. "I didn't think we played bad, they were just the better team at the end. We started very well, but couldn't finish. But today we saw we can compete with the best teams in the world."

Over at Mall of Asia Arena in Pasay City, Egypt stunned world No. 13 Iran,

25-17, 16-25, 25-23, 25-20, in Pool A.

The World No. 23 Africans outperformed their Asian rivals in attack, 52-45, and in serving aces, 8-4.

Egypt's outside hitters Ahmed Shafik Said and Abdelrahman Elhossiny led the way with 18 and 17 points, respectively, including one ace and one kill block each.

The Philippines will face Egypt on Tuesday at 5:30 p.m.

"The key was that everybody on the team -- from the youngest player to the oldest, as well as the coaches -- did their best in preparing for the game very well. We knew exactly how to play against Iran, to counter their strongest points and play on their weakest points. Everyone did very well and I think this was the key," Elhossiny said in the post-match inter-

"It was a very good game for us and I hope we continue on this level."

Back-to-back Olympic champion France was playing South Korea at Araneta Coliseum as of posting time. Defending champion Italy will then debut against Algeria at 9:30 p.m. (FIVB Media)
